To be of maximum utility in this work, the HIT system must be modifiable, and the organization must be willing to authorize and prioritize the work.

If the HIT system cannot be modified as needed for all of the above functions, it may be necessary to start out with a project of limited scope that focuses on actions that automatically generate structured data such as fluoride varnish in young children or referrals. If the organization cannot commit the resources to report, it may be necessary to find ways to document actions in ways that don't involve the EHR, such as a standalone registry or sampling.
