Findings:

1. Three quadrants mild, one quadrant moderate-severe periodontal disease.
2. Multiple teeth with superficial early caries in enamel, one tooth with decay into the dentin.

Today's treatment:

1. Full mouth cleaning, x-rays, and exam
2. Reviewed oral hygiene and dietary goals. Started fluoride rinse daily.

Treatment plan:

1. Scheduled for restoration of involved tooth in two weeks.
2. Scheduled for one quadrant scaling in four weeks.
